



What might volunteers be asked to do?

MRC of Carver County volunteers help out when there is a public health emergency. They may help staff a mass dispensing clinic giving antibiotics or injections. They may inform residents when any type of public health emergency threatens. MRC volunteers are trained in Psychological First Aid, Personal and Family Preparedness, Mass Dispensing Sites and more.

Red Cross volunteers arrive shortly after disaster strikes, whether it's a single family house fire, storm, flood or other crisis. They help find food, shelter and clothing for individuals and families. Red Cross volunteers also give training in First Aid, CPR, AED and work in bloodmobiles.

Waconia Area CERT volunteers work hand-in-hand with fire departments, law enforcement agencies and emergency medical services in emergency and non-emergency situations. CERT members are trained to help in a neighborhood disaster when first responders are not immediately available.

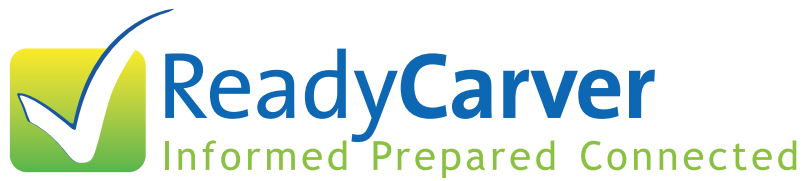
